Life Group Behaviors

Our Life Groups are shaped by three core values: Authentic, Biblical, and Committed. These values describe the kind of people we want to become. The Life Group Behaviors listed below will help the group live out these values together in real, meaningful, and transformational ways.

1. No Masks Allowed

We live honestly and openly, not hiding or pretending to be something we're not. Life Group is a mask-free zone. We are only as healthy as we are honest. "Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good." – Romans 12:9

2. Laugh Hard, Loud, and Often

We prioritize fun! Laughter is a sign of health and trust. We take the Gospel seriously. Ourselves? Not so much. "A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones." – Proverbs 17:22

3. Process and Pray, Not Just Report

We don't just share life updates; we help discern God's work and will in each other's lives. Life Group is our wise counsel. "The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice." – Proverbs 12:15

4. Talk to Each Other, Not About Each Other

We reject gossip and deal with conflict directly, with humility and love. "If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you." – Matthew 18:15

5. Be First Responders

We show up for one another quickly to serve, encourage, pray, and celebrate. We support one another through life's ups and downs. "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." – Galatians 6:2

6. Everyone Participates, No One Dominates
